As we continue pondering the future of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, I invite you to pray about the following thoughts and to ask yourself, "Where do I fit in this picture? What is my role? What am I willing and planning to do and give to influence this future?"

Traditionally a Christian church is seen to have five major responsibilities or reasons to exist. Every congrega-

tion fulfills some better than others. All are necessary and must, at least basically, exist for a church to continue.

Worship – We gather regularly to praise God and to build our relationship with God. Our Sunday gatherings are meant to inspire, instruct, uplift and renew us in our relationship with God. Is that your experience?

Education – We change, life changes, the world changes. Every living thing changes. Our faith also needs to grow as we meet these changes. How is the church doing at helping you and others with that growth?

Fellowship – We are encouraged and instructed in life and in faith by our interaction with other Christians. What opportunities for that interaction do we offer? How are they received and used?

Outreach – From the beginning Jesus said, "Go and make disciples" (Matthew 28). This is not a survival strategy. It is because the message we have is too valuable to keep to ourselves – it is meant for everyone. What are the ways we do that? Are there other ideas that should be tried?

Serve - Having spent the last year in Luke's Gospel we have been reminded over and over of Jesus' concern for the poor and the outcast, for those alone or in need. In actions and in influence, how are we doing at addressing need and injustice, at giving hope and peace?

This is just a basic introduction to the reasons a church exists. Chapter 4, "Statement of Purpose" in our congregational constitution covers this list more fully. I invite you to review it (There is a copy attached to the church directory or it is available from the church office.)

How satisfied are you with Good Shepherd's involvement in these responsibilities? What is our potential for growth in them? What would be lost to the community if Good Shepherd were not here?

I look forward to discussing these questions with you.


